The care many receive is life changing, as many had lost the freedom to smile or laugh without feeling self-conscious or embarrassed by their appearance. It is an immeasurable sense of joy and relief to regain the ability to smile confidently for the first time in years. Moreover, the volunteers believe they receive as much, if not more, from this experience than their patients, and they look forward to returning year after year.






A typical Mission of Mercy clinic, over a two-day span, provides care to 2,000 patients. All patients receive whatever care they need, being escorted from station to station (hygiene, x-ray, restoration, root canal etc.) and if there is any need for follow up care, the patient is encouraged to visit the dentist's office for follow up visits, free of charge.
