- PWS-LB-1 1.25 gallon lead bucket

- Use for:
- Bitewing X-ray
 - Sterilization tape

- PWS-LB-A 2.5 gallon lead apron bucket

- Use for:
- Lead aprons (max of 2)
 - Thyroid collars

Items placed in lead buckets:

- Bitewing x-ray
- Sterilization tape
- Lead apron bucket (maximum of 2)

- PWS-BH-20 20 gallon biohazard & sharps container disposal*

Items placed in biohazard containers:

- Sharps containers
- Sponges

Dry Waste — Safely store contact and non-contact amalgam, spent amalgam capsules, chair-side traps, central vacuum filters and extracted teeth containing amalgam. Recycle when full or before 12 months, whichever is first.
